THE HOBBIT: CH 1 KEY POINTS



- **Introduction to Bilbo Baggins:** Bilbo is a hobbit who enjoys a peaceful, comfortable life in his cozy home, Bag End, with no desire for adventure. His quiet existence reflects typical hobbit values—comfort, routine, and respectability.
- **Gandalf's Arrival:** The wizard Gandalf visits Bilbo, hinting at an adventure. Bilbo, being a typical hobbit, immediately refuses any idea of leaving his comfortable life for something so unpredictable.

THE HOBBIT: CHAPTER 2 KEY POINTS
